SCOPE AND CONTENT: The Richard Evelyn Byrd Collection contains correspondence, photographs, news clippings, awards, newsletters, speeches and other materials relevant to Admiral Richard E. Byrd (1880-1979) and his expeditions to Antarctica. Also included is an atlas called *Polar Regions*, which provides an in-depth comparison of the two Polar Regions.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Richard Evelyn Byrd was born in Winchester, VA on October 25, 1881, son of Richard Evelyn Byrd II and Eleanor Bolling Flood. At the early age of 12, having a thirst for adventure, he persuaded his parents to permit him to make an unattended trip around the world. After two years at Virginia Military Institute and one year at the University of Virginia, he was admitted to the U.S. Naval Academy on May 28, 1908. He became interested in exploration and undertook a number of long-distance flights across the Atlantic and the North and South Poles. He organized five expeditions to the Antarctic. During World War II, Byrd served on the staff of the chief of naval operations.

Byrd became a national figure through his explorations and his expeditions advanced the fields of aviation technology, reconnaissance, and aerial photography. His work also produced significant new findings about the Antarctic region. Byrd married Marie Donaldson Ames on January 20, 1915. They had four children. Admiral Byrd died in his sleep on March 11, 1957 in Boston, Massachusetts.
