SCOPE AND CONTENT: Miscellaneous Manuscript Files (MMF) are small collections typically containing only a folder or two of materials. This collection contains three folders related to Thomas Allan and his son William Allan: one genealogical material, one a copy of Thomas Allan's *Reminiscence*, and one a tribute to Col. William Allan and his work on the McDonough School.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Thomas Allan was born in Scotland in 1802 and died in Winchester in 1875. He was buried at Mount Hebron Cemetery in Winchester, VA. Col. William Allan was the son of Thomas and Jane Allan. He was an ordinance officer of General "Stonewall" Jackson. Following the Civil War, he was a professor at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, VA. In April 1873, he was principal at the McDonough School near Baltimore, MD.
