SCOPE AND CONTENT: This collection contains correspondence, wills, and other ephemera related to the Baker family.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Alfred Jackson Baker was born in Winchester on August 5, 1878. He married May Virginia Patton (1888-1972) of Kingston, Tennessee. The Bakers had two children, John Goodwin Baker (1918-1979) and May Patton Konie (1912-2001).

Alfred was the son of George Goodwin Baker (1852-1914), a clerk at Shenandoah Valley National Bank, and Henrietta M. Jackson (1854-1887). Through his father's second wife, Lucy Gibson (1867-1941), he had two half-siblings: Goodwin Gibson Baker (1894-1968) and Mary Bruce Baker (1895-1972).

Around 1900, Alfred moved to Washington, D.C. where he worked for the Government Printing Office and then the United States Postal Service. He retired in 1948 and died on 14 November 1959. Both Alfred and May are buried in Mount Hebron Cemetery in Winchester City.

Alfred's grandfather, Josiah Lockhart Baker (1878-1959) was the great-grandson of Henry Baker (1733-1808), who was born in Germany and emigrated to the American colonies in 1755. The Henry Baker family was among the first German families to settle in Frederick County.

Josiah was an organ builder and had a successful business in Winchester. He and his wife Alcinda lived in a large brick house at 806 Berryville Avenue, known as *Osborn*. The house is notable for the artillery and rifle damage it incurred during the Third Battle of Winchester in September 1864. The house eventually passed to Goodwin Gibson Baker in 1930 and was then sold by him in 1858. Shortly thereafter it was demolished to make way for a retail center.

ARRANGEMENT: Letters and other papers are arranged chronologically as correspondence files. The collection also includes one folder of undated material; one folder of mixed papers and ephemera, and one folder concerning the will of Alfred Jackson Baker.
