BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: John Blake Bergers was born in Omaha, Nebraska in 1931 and died in Lindsborg, Kansas in 2011. He was a professional artist who focused on painting historical and landscape scenes of the Midwest. He was particularly inspired by the depictions of landscapes in Willa Cather's novels.

Author Willa Cather (1873-1947) was born in Back Creek Valley, Frederick County, Virginia. Her family moved to Nebraska when she was nine years old. Her novels and short stories spanned numerous settings including the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia.
