**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL**: During the decades after the Civil War there was a resurgence of southern patriotism in what became known as the "Lost Cause." The collection contains a variety of small publications related to this topic in the form of speeches and addresses to organizations like the Sons of Confederate Veterans and the United Daughters of the Confederacy (including multiple speeches by Mildred Lewis Rutherford) and dedications to confederate monuments.
