**SCOPE AND CONTENT**: The collection contains various materials concerning the history of the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company, or the C & P Telephone Co. as it was known in Winchester, VA. This includes a history of the company, telephone directories, and other miscellaneous items.

C&P telephone directories from the years 1932-1995 are filed in the reading room; 1931-1932 and 1939 are filed in the rare collection.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: The Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company, founded in the late 1800s, served Washington D.C., Maryland, West Virginia, and Virginia. The Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company of Virginia, also known as C&P, served the localities of Berryville, Boyce, Gainesboro, Gore, Middletown, Stephens City, Winchester, and likely many other areas in Virginia. C&P of Virginia's general office was in Richmond, and they had a local office in Winchester, as well as an office in Berryville briefly. Local newspapers suggest C&P had set sights on Winchester in the early 1900s.

C&P was a part of the Bell System ran by the American Telephone and Telegraph Company (AT&T). C&P later became a Bell Atlantic company around 1984. Around 1995, the C&P name was dropped from the directories, and the name Bell Atlantic remained until it became Verizon.
