BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: VFW Post #6044 was established in 1959 by African American veterans in the Winchester and Frederick County area. It was initially named for Edgar Davis, a veteran of World War I. Just a few months after its founding, the name of the post was amended to honor Charles Williams, a World War II veteran, and it was thereafter known as the Davis-Williams Post.
