SCOPE AND CONTENT: The collection contains a scrapbook with newspaper clippings and photographs documenting the nurses training school at the Winchester Memorial Hospital from 1920 – 1968.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Hazel Evans Foreman was born on November 28, 1902 in West Virginia. She entered training at the Nurse's Training School at Winchester Memorial Hospital on February 15, 1925 and graduated on June 28, 1928. Following graduation, she worked as a private duty nurse at the hospital and in private homes until 1930. She then began relief work at Winchester Memorial Hospital as a supervisor, becoming full time in 1935. She continued working full time at the hospital until 1978, at which point she retired, but continued relief duty until the summer of 1980. She continued part time private duty nursing at Shawnee Springs Nursing Home until the day of her death on October 12, 1981.

In her fifty-three-year association with the hospital, she worked on every floor with stints on medical, surgical, pediatrics, emergency room, psychiatry, and obstetrics. She served as a clinical instructor for the nurses training school. From 1960 until her retirement, she was the evening supervisor for surgical floors, emergency room and psychiatry.
