**SCOPE AND CONTENT**: This collection contains a scrapbook of Elizabeth Helm's campaign for mayor of Winchester, VA, USA, her election, and activities. It consists of news articles, photographs, notes, etc. covering Sept. 1986 to May 1996.

The remainder of the collection contains various material concerning Helm's life and career, to include information about the family home, Fair Mount, correspondence, ephemera, and other documents from her term as mayor, and information about Shawnee Springs. Box 2 contains Helm's speeches and photographs.

**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL**: Elizabeth Glaize Helm was the first woman elected to the office of Mayor of Winchester, serving from May 1988 to May 1992. She was born in Winchester in 1931 and married Dr. W. Jackson Helm in 1954, with whom she had three children.

Helm graduated from Wellesley College and later began a career in banking and finance. She was involved in numerous policy areas at the local, state, and national levels.
