SCOPE AND CONTENT: The Jim Barnett Park Collection contains materials concerning the development of Jim Barnett Park in Winchester, Virginia. The bulk of the materials are organizational papers, tax records, correspondence, committee reports, and plans, produced by the Winchester-Frederick County War Memorial Association, which began campaigning to develop the park in 1945. There are also budget reports from the years, 1969 to 1974, information about the Fast Pitch Softball Hall of Fame, and newspaper clippings.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Jim Barnett Park began as a small community playground located on land on the outskirts of Winchester City and offered organized recreational activities for the town's residents. In 1945, the Winchester-Frederick County War Memorial Association initiated a fund-raising campaign to build a complex honoring veterans of Winchester and Frederick County. The campaign was successful, and a ribbon cutting ceremony for the new War Memorial Building took place on November 11, 1956. The City has continued to expand the park by adding various new features and amenities.

The park is named after James E. Barnett, who served as its director for thirty years before his retirement in 1987. Barnett was a native of Huntington, West Virginia and attended the University of Kentucky. He began his career with the City of Winchester in 1957. At the time, the Winchester Recreation Park consisted of the original War Memorial Building and some picnic shelters. During his tenure, Barnett oversaw a significant expansion of the park's offerings, including the swimming pool complex, Christianson Familyland, an amphitheater, a fishing lake, sports facilities, and other amenities. He also encouraged local civic groups to sponsor picnic shelters and established numerous sports programs for children and youth. On August 26, 1987, the Winchester Parks & Recreation Board resolved that the City Recreation Park should be known as "Jim Barnett Park."
