SCOPE AND CONTENT: This collection contains notes, news clippings, and correspondence about a number of historic properties in the City of Winchester and Frederick County.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: John G. Lewis had an active interest in architectural interest and began gathering information on properties in the City of Winchester, Frederick, Loudoun and Clarke counties in the 1950s. Lewis was born in Richmond, VA in 1930 and attended high school in Leesburg, VA. After a period of service with the U.S. Army in Korea, Lewis returned to Leesburg and began to restore and sell historic buildings. Lewis later became the regional representative for the Department of Historic Resources. In this position he documented over 600 structures in the Winchester-Frederick County area and in Northern Virginia. In 1980, Lewis moved to Winchester, and he became an active member of the Winchester-Frederick County Historical Society. He also continued purchasing, restoring and reselling historic homes. Lewis died in April 2013.
