SCOPE AND CONTENT: This collection contains numerous essays by J. Floyd Wine which cover a wide variety of subjects on the history of the Shenandoah Valley. The collection also includes Wine's sermon written in anticipation of his one hundredth birthday in 2017.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: J. Floyd Wine was born in 1917 in Shenandoah County, Virginia. He made his career in the Winchester Post Office and served as a minister for the Church of the Brethren. He was also active in his community and volunteered at the Stewart Bell Jr. Archives, Handley Regional Library. Additionally, he served as Director Emeritus of the Winchester-Frederick County Historical Society and was a member and former director of the Shenandoah Valley Folklife Society. He died on December 13, 2015.
