SCOPE AND CONTENT: Miscellaneous Manuscript Files (MMF) are small collections typically containing only a folder or two of materials. This collection contains correspondence related to the Zirkle family in Winchester, VA.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Abraham Zirkle was born in 1852 in Virginia, and he was a butcher in Winchester. He had at least four children, including Nannie (born 1876), Mary (May) (born 1878), and Louise (born 1884). The family lived on South Loudoun Street during the period when the letters were written. Abraham died in 1906 and is buried in Mount Hebron Cemetery in Winchester, VA.
