**SCOPE AND CONTENT**: The Hiram Fries Papers is an incomplete series of diaries written by Mr. Fries between 1867 and 1899. There are twenty-four diaries in total, each one documenting Fries's daily routine as he managed his farm in Northwestern Frederick County near White Hall. The diaries include details about weather, farm accounts, crop and livestock prices, news of family and neighbors, and social events. Transcriptions of the diaries are available in Box 3 for the following years: 1867, 1868, 1869, 1870, 1879, 1880, 1881, 1882, 1883, 1884, 1885, 1887, 1889.

The collection also includes a wooden box made by Fries to hold the diaries, notes on the diaries written by Robert Fries, two farm account books covering the periods January 1876 to December 1883 and January 1901 to November 1904 and photographs of the Fries family and their property.

#### **BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL:**

Hiram Fries (1840-1904) was a child of Michael Fries and Catherine (Fries) Fries. The Fries family had settled in Frederick County in the 1780s, having emigrated from Pennsylvania. They made their home in the Green Spring area and, along with other families, established the Old Stone Church at Green Spring. Martin and

Catherine Fries, the original settlers, also leased land to establish a subscription school in 1812, which Hiram would later attend.

Hiram Fries lived in Green Spring his whole life, becoming a prosperous and well-respected farmer. He married Elizabeth Anne Fries (1844-1926) in November 1864. The couple had four children, three of whom survived to adulthood. Fries completed a diary for every year between 1867 and 1904, although some are now lost or in private hands.
