SCOPE AND CONTENT: The Shenandoah Normal College Collection contains a variety of material about the school, including catalogs, commencement programs, a newsletter, a history, a biographical sketch of its founder, photographs, and newspaper articles.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: George Washington Hoenshel (1858 - 1896) of Pennsylvania established Shenandoah Normal College in Middletown, Frederick County, Va., in September 1883. The school was co-educational with its primary mission being the education of teachers. The school moved its campus several times to different locations within the Shenandoah Valley. It finally relocated to Berkeley Springs, West Virginia, in 1914. Declining enrollment eventually forced the school to close in 1922.
