Branch Administration

- **Branch Visits Foster Organizational Relations:** Although the Deputy Director visits the Bowman and Clarke County Branches regularly, most of her time is spent at the Handley Branch in management meetings and job application interviews. In an effort to garner a feel for the flow of operations at the Bowman Library, and to reacquaint herself with branch staff, the Deputy Director took the opportunity to work two afternoons at the Circulation desk there. It provided a chance to catch up with staff, and to revisit circulation policies and procedures. It also allowed her to learn about Bowman's RFID materials handler that automatically sorts returning materials.



New Resources for Patrons

- **Netspot Laptop Kiosk:** The Handley branch now has 6 laptops available for in-house use with 2-hour checkout periods. The laptops can be used anywhere in the library that fits the needs of the patron, whether it's at a desk or in a comfortable chair, independently or in a work group. From installation on the 14th, until the end of September, patron used Netspot laptops for a total of 15.6 hours.

- **Brainfuse HelpNow:** September saw the addition of "Brainfuse HelpNow" to the digital library. This resource is paid for by the Library of Virginia with ARPA, (American Rescue Plan Act) funds. It provides live, certified educator assistance for homework, research and writing in all subjects for grades K-college, seven day a week from 2 pm to 11pm.
 - **Accel 5:** Also paid for with ARPA funds through the Library of Virginia, Accel 5 Business Library features short videos on topics including business competencies, leadership and management, and personal effectiveness; summaries from business and leadership books; and articles by industry leaders on current working world issues.

- **Finally, In-Person Programing:** After 17 months of virtual programing, the Friends held their first in-person program, “Judge Richard Parker, A man of His Times”. The presentation was of particular interest to the active local historical community not only because the Judge was a resident of Winchester, but because of the role he played in the critical period surrounding the Civil War. Judge Richard Parker, a graduate of University of Virginia, had been elected judge of the thirteenth judicial circuit in Virginia in 1851. He was living in Winchester when he served as the judge in the trial of John Brown and his men after the raid on Harpers Ferry in 1859. Parker lived in Winchester until his death in 1893.

- **Books by the Bag:** Book Bundles were launched at Bowman this month, first in Youth Services followed by bundles for adults. These contain about five items centered on a specific theme, and packaged in a bag with other library promotional materials. Using the self-check out system, patrons are able to checkout an entire bag without removing the items. The bags had agricultural themed tags under the overall theme of “Picked Fresh for You”.

- **Welcome Packets:** Handley has developed a literal “Cornucopia of Library Resources” with the new informational packets created to help our newest members discover the Library. Assembled by Information Services staff, the packets include all the handouts and flyers that promote Library programs and services, from the monthly calendar to the Digital Library brochure, plus bookmarks, book suggestion and a couple of small gifts.
- **Hispanic Heritage Month:** A “mixed format and genres display took center stage during the month of September, with works by such authors as a Jorge Luis Borges, Gabriel García Márquez, Gabriela Mistral, and Octavio Paz.
- **New Newsletter:** The Handley Youth Services Department kicked off a brand, new newsletter subscription for the parents and teachers in kids’ lives. The “Parent-Teacher Hacks” Newsletter is another LibraryAware newsletter that helps grown-ups find new book recommendations for parent/caregiving skills and the latest teacher tools to build resilient and kind kids in and out of the classroom

- **Historic Marker for Dr. Madison Briscoe Approved:** The Archives has been involved with many projects to collect and share information about African Americans in our community. To this end, a Black History Task Force was developed to assist with a variety of projects. Members included: Judy Humbert, Sharon Dixon, and Ann Grogg. and Becky Ebert. The Task Force proposed a goal of applying to the Virginia Historic Landmark Commission to install historic highway markers commemorating notable African Americans of the community. Brenda Nelson joined the group and efforts were begun to recognize Dr. Madison Briscoe (1904-1955), The Brown Family and Robert Orrick. An unveiling of the Dr. Madison Briscoe marker is being planned for the Spring.
