A Very Productive Month At Clarke County

Once again, members of the Clarke County Library "Sit and Stitch" program flooded the talent pool at the **Clarke County Fair** and came home with 15 first place blue ribbons and 10 second place red ribbons for their handmade creations seen in the photo on the right.

Adding a new, part time staff member allowed the branch to add three new programs with more to come in the following months.

- "Baby Blocks", a new Lego Club but with bigger blocks for smaller toddler hands
- "Pokémon Card Game", a social event for the 6-11 age range
- "Magic: The Gathering" the newest offering for teens



In collaboration with the **Clarke County Public Schools New Teacher Academy**, the Clarke County branch welcomed 26 new teachers to the library for a tour and information about all the products and services offered by the library. The successful visit even resulted in nine new library cards for the new teachers.

On June 3, 2023, a ribbon cutting ceremony was held for the new amphitheater at the Bowman Library. A collaborative effort between the library and the **Frederick County Parks and Recreation Department**, the amphitheater has proven to be a great success in helping to make Bowman Library a special destination in Frederick County. The Sunset Series has grown from its initial three concerts held in 2023 to nine in 2024 and this year the bill grew to twelve performances. Ending in August, this year's series had an attendance of over 2,000: individuals, friends, and families who enjoyed this special entertainment venue.
