

Handley Library is Busy "Growing Readers"

The Handley Youth Services Department celebrated the soft launch of the new **Grow a Reader** program brand that will encompass all the library's efforts to help our very youngest patrons (0 to 5 years) and their families to be "school ready". Over two hundred participants gathered for the event that included a puppet show, games, crafts, face painting, balloons, and even cotton candy, while families and caregivers learned




Reading Together
